These values will create a learning environment which will challenge our students to stretch themselves academically, be socially responsible and ready to make a positive impact on and in our community.

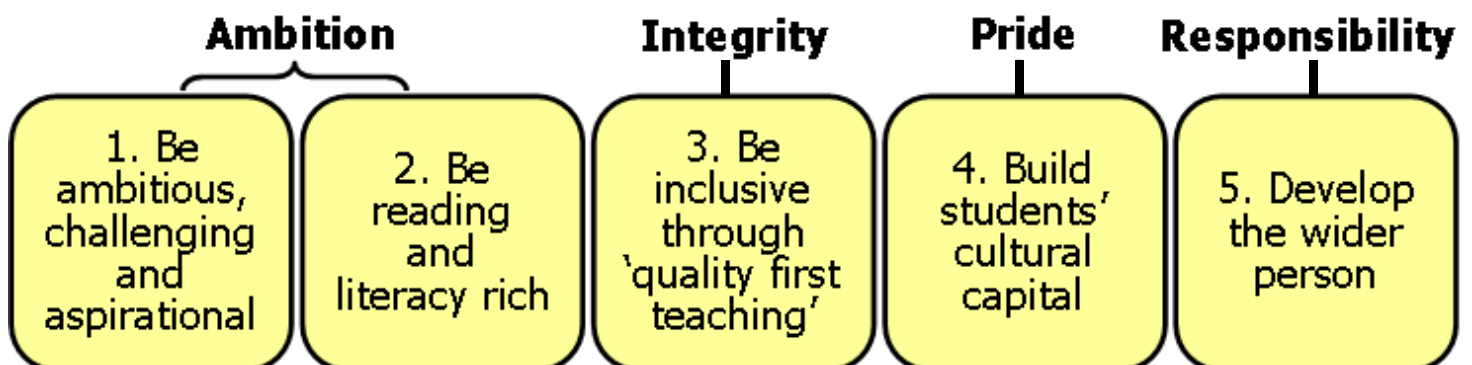


Whole School Intent

Attendance

Every Day Counts at Campsmount!

Starting secondary school is an exciting new chapter, and we're here to help every step of the way. One of the most important ways you can help your child succeed at Campsmount is by making sure they attend school every day. When students are in school regularly, they don't just keep up, they thrive! The connection between school, students and families is important. When we all work together, amazing things happen. Research and experience show us that students who have excellent attendance go on to achieve the best results in their GCSEs especially in key subjects like English and Maths.

For example, students with attendance above 95% consistently achieve the highest grades. Sadly, no students with attendance below 85% managed to get a 'standard pass' in both English and Maths. This shows just how powerful daily attendance can be.

To give you an idea:

- 95% attendance = about 8 ½ school days missed – that's around 51 lessons.
- 90% attendance = about 19 days missed – that's 114 lessons your child would need to catch up on!

We understand that sometimes illness or emergencies happen and that's okay. But wherever possible, every school day really does count.

You Can Help by:

- Avoiding holidays in term time there are 175 other days in the year for this.
- Booking routine medical appointments outside school hours where possible.
- Encouraging your child to come in for minor illnesses like headaches or colds, we're here to support them.
- Getting in touch with us early if you have any concerns we have experienced and caring staff ready to help.

Universal Principles

Our Universal Principles ensure that Campsmount is a calm, happy, purposeful learning environment.

A Guide to Achieve our Universal Principles:

In Lessons

Start of lesson

Be **PREPARED** - have your equipment out ready to put on the desk.

Be **RESPECTFUL** - enter quietly and calmly and complete the activate task in silence, answering 'Here Sir/Miss' during the register.

Be **SAFE** –bags and coats safely away.

During lesson

Be **PREPARED** - work hard and have a positive attitude to your learning.

Be **RESPECTFUL** - work in silence when you have been asked to not disturb others by talking.

Be **SAFE** – when required, move around the classroom sensibly.

End of lesson

Be **PREPARED** – pack away quickly and quietly when instructed.

Be **RESPECTFUL** - stand behind your chair in silence so the teacher knows you are ready to leave.

Be **SAFE** - your teacher will dismiss you one row at a time. Leave the room sensibly and walk on the left.

Beyond the Classroom

Be **PREPARED**: Wear full school uniform and be smart in appearance.

Be **RESPECTFUL**: Use school property and buildings sensibly and keep them free from litter and graffiti.

Be **RESPECTFUL**: Follow instructions first time.

Be **RESPECTFUL**: Accept when you have received a consequence.

Be **SAFE**: Around the building act in a manner that keeps everybody safe

Be **SAFE**: Keep to the left on corridors and stairs.

Be **SAFE**: Mobile phones are switched off and are out of sight.

Be **SAFE**: Keep hands and feet to yourself.

House System

The House system at Campsmount Academy allows for students to engage on both an individual and group basis with a range of activities, challenges and rewards throughout the year. The aim of the House system is to provide a sense of unity and collaboration between staff and students and to develop a growth mindset. Our house system aims to promote a positive school culture through:

- Teamwork
- Identity
- Leadership
- Competition

At Campsmount Academy we not only want our students to focus on their academic achievements but also their achievements outside of the classroom. Students are encouraged to share and celebrate their achievements with their tutors to receive additional House Points as well as their achievements being shared across the school.

House Rewards

Students have the opportunity to earn House Points daily through Class Charts. Points are awarded during lessons and for participation in additional activities, such as House Challenges. Each student will have a cumulative House Points total and a spendable points balance displayed in Class Charts. Spendable points can be used to purchase a variety of items from the Reward Store. In addition to these ongoing rewards, students may also be selected to attend exclusive Golden Ticket Reward Events, held at the end of each term. Invitations to these events are based on factors such as:

- Demonstrated growth mindset
- Personal achievements
- Academic progress

This system is designed to celebrate effort, improvement, and engagement across all areas of school life.



PE and Extra-Curricular Activities

PE Kit

Our students are required to wear a uniform for PE. This is outlined in our Uniform Guide
Our school PE kit consists of:

- Campsmount PE Top
- Campsmount Shorts, or Campsmount female leggings or Campsmount training pants
- Campsmount Sports socks

Optional

- Students may choose to wear a long-sleeved top for PE lessons. However, if they do so, it must be the official Campsmount ¼ zip training top or hoodie, available exclusively from SWI Schoolwear or APC Clothing. No other long-sleeved tops are permitted.
- We recommend the use of shin pads for football activities and mouth guards for rugby activities.

Extra-Curricular Activities

What to do if.....

I am late -

If you arrive at school after 8.45am go to main reception to sign in otherwise sign in at the student entrance at the sports centre

I am absent -

Parents to contact the academy through either phone call 01302 700002, option 1 or email: attendance@campsmount.com

I have a medical/dental appointment -

Please try to make appointments for out of school hours. If unavoidable please bring in a letter from your parents/carers and your appointment card to show to attendance. When it's time for your appointment you sign out at reception to leave. You are expected to attend school either before or after your appointment.

I have lost something -

Students are advised to go and check lost property at Main Reception at the next available time, for example break/lunch time. Students can also see their Form Tutor

I forgot my PE kit -

Students are to go to Main Reception at the next available time to ask our reception team to try to contact home. You can also borrow PE kit from the PE department

I am being bullied or know someone who is -

Students see their Form Tutor, Pastoral Leader or Progress Leader at the next available time

I do not feel well or I need to take medication -

Students are to go to Student Services
