Summary:

During year one on the A-Level literature course, Post 16 students study 'Aspects of Tragedy'. They read, explore and analyse: The Tragedy of Othello by William Shakespeare; Death of a Salesman by Arthur Miller and John Keats' seminal poems: Lamia; La Belle Dames Sans Merci; Isabella or the Pot of Basil and The Eve of St. Agnes. Students also start their Non-Examination Assessment. They are tasked with writing two 1,500 word essays, analysing texts from a range of perspectives and theoretical standpoints such as Marxism and Post-Colonial Theory.

Year two is the year that students study Elements of Political and Social Protest. They read: The Handmaid's Tale by Margaret Atwood; Songs of Innocence and Experience by William Blake; The Kite Runner by Khaled Hosseini and an unseen element.
