Summary:

The A level History covers 2 papers and an NEA (coursework) that is completed in Y13.

Paper 1 is the British depth study which develops an understanding of change and continuity over time. It is a thematic study which looks at government policies, religion, character, society, trade and the economy and foreign policy under each Tudor Monarch. Students will develop analysis and evaluative skills through looking at interpretations and judging the extent of change.

Paper 2 in Year 12 students explore impact of WW1 on Germany and establishment of the Weimar republic and policies they put in place and what impact they have. Short and long term impact of the Treaty of Versailles, the Golden era and the rise of Nazism towards the end of the 1920s. In Year 13 students then look at social, economic and racial policy under the Nazis, the Holocaust, WW2 and responsibility for the Holocaust.
