



Results Celebration Summer 2021

It has been so wonderful this week to share the celebrations with our Year 11 and 13 students following their exceptional results. Despite what has been a most unusual and challenging academic year the results are testament to their hard work and resilience over the years. Staff have all worked extremely hard to support the students achieve these truly great results and to provide the robust evidence required.

There have been some outstanding performances from individuals within the year group. Our overall results have continued to improve from strength to strength and this should be celebrated.

Across the group 30% of students grades were the very highest grades 7 to 9 and 81% were 4 to 9. The main key performance indicators of Attainment 8 (51.33) and Progress 8 (+0.6) were very significantly above the national average and an increase of 0.1 from last year. Mathematics and English (best of) 4+ 70% and 5+ 48% (2020 4+ 64%, 5+ 42%).

It has been a real team effort this year and it was especially pleasing to see so many staff this week, celebrating with our students.

Congratulations to everyone for everything that we have achieved this year and we are so proud of the student's success today. This is the start of an incredibly exciting journey today for all of them and we wish them all the best in everything that they do in the future.
