All students can grab a FREE nutritious breakfast to help feed their minds ready for a productive day of learning everyday 8am – 8.30am.

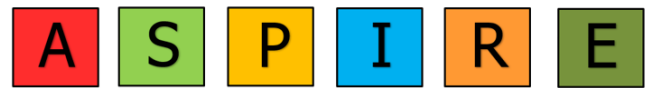




ASPIRE
